Wrong emphasis:


Surveillance (information collection)

Privacy as an Environmental Issue


The overexploitation of our privacy is akin to the overexploitation of our natural resources.

Tech Giants' Power to Shape Society

- 1. The power of large web companies comes from their ability to direct attention, the fundamental currency of the media world.
 - 2. The victory of the U.S. and Chinese models has a strong tendency to make <u>other models seem impractical</u>.
 - 3. We <u>rely on the word</u> of the tech platforms.

"Our solutions <u>cannot be limited to asking</u> these platforms to do a better job of meeting their civic obligations – we need to <u>consider what technologies we want</u> and need for digital media to have a productive role in democratic societies."

"[...] this <u>failure of imagination</u> means that we are ceding the future of the internet to the companies that have already taken power."




REFLECTION

Reimagined Digital Domain

- A 1% tax on highly surveillant advertising could generate a \$1–2 billion annual fund to support public service digital media.
- A non-surveillant advertising network could directly challenge existing market leaders.
- We can own our data, and share it with the application we want to use.






- Provocative vs.Predictive / Prescriptive
